Instructions for 4E5N Classes

- All classes will take their exams in form classrooms, unless otherwise stated in the timetable. However, further instructions on changes of room may be given on the morning of the papers if the need arises.
 All students will report to school at least half an hour before the start of the examination.
- - For papers beginning at 8.00 am, students must attend the flag-raising ceremony.
- 4. Students are **NOT** allowed to leave the examination rooms before the end of each paper.
- 5. Students are to read and be clear of the "Instructions to Examination Candidates" on the reverse page.
- 6. Checking of exam scripts will commence on 18.9.2018 (Tuesday).

Instructions to Examination Candidates

A. Examination Rules and Regulations for School Candidates:

You are expected to comply with these rules and regulations.

1. You may be prohibited from taking the examination, expelled from the examination room, refused entry for subsequent papers, have his/her results terminated or a grade penalty, if you breach any exam rules and regulations.

2. You must not have in your possession:

- 2.1 Any unauthorised electronic, communication, entertainment or gaming devices capable of capturing, storing, displaying and/or transmitting visual, audio or verbal information within the examination premises (e.g. Examination Room, Quarantine Room, Waiting Room). Examples of prohibited items include mobile phones, cameras, tablets, and smart wrist watches/glasses, pen with image capturing capabilities.
- 2.2 Any unauthorised reference materials/notes. All stationery/belongings taken into the exam venue (e.g. pencil case, calculator cover, cover for ruler, entry proof) must not have any unauthorised notes/information written on them. You must also ensure you do not have any information or notes written on any parts of your body (e.g. hands and thighs). Examples of prohibited items include conversion table/mathematical formula sheet enclosed in or printed on the mathematical instrument box, any study notes or any exam question papers.
- 3. You must not commit or attempt any acts of dishonesty, or the support of such acts (e.g. Taking the exam on someone else's behalf, using unauthorised devices to gain an advantage, copying of answers).
- 4. **You must not commit plagiarism** (i.e. using someone else's work or findings without acknowledging the source of that information) or the support of such offences.
- 5. You must not communicate or attempt to communicate with any other candidate/person inside or outside the examination room during the examination or any other occasion when communication with any other candidate/person is strictly prohibited (e.g. during group movement to the quarantine area).
- 6. You must not turn around and should also only face the front during the examination.
- 7. You must not write any offensive or obscene materials in your answer script.
- 8. You must not exhibit improper conduct or misbehaviour during the examination. For example, disrupting other candidates, leaving examination area without approval or unescorted, not obeying instructions from invigilators.
- 9. You must not continue to write after the invigilator has made the announcement to stop writing.
- 10. You must not remove any examination material and stationery, including any answer booklet, writing paper, storage devices and other used or unused exam stationery from the examination venue, without permission.

Use of Scientific Calculators and Dictionaries

- 11. You must adhere to the following rules where the use of scientific calculators and dictionaries are allowed in examinations. Any non-compliance will be considered a breach of the examination regulations and you may be subjected to the penalty measures.
 - 11.1 You are only allowed to use the approved calculator models.
 - 11.2 Your calculator must be silent, with a visual display only.
 - 11.3 You are to ensure that the calculator is in working condition (including the power supply) and any fault in the calculator will not be considered as justification for special consideration.
 - 11.4 You are not allowed to share calculators with another candidate during the examination.
 - 11.5 Your calculator and its cover **must not have any** mathematical formula, conversion table or instructions. Any such information on the calculator that cannot be removed must be securely covered.
 - 11.6 You are only allowed to use approved printed dictionaries or handheld electronic dictionaries for MTL Paper 1.
 - 11.7 Your e-dictionaries must be silent and battery operated.
 - 11.8 No allowance will be made for candidates whose e-dictionaries fail to function during the examination. You should ensure that a replacement set of batteries is available. Ear-pieces are not permitted in the examination venue.
 - 11.9 You are not allowed to share or borrow dictionary from other candidates during the examination.
 - 11.10 You are only allowed to use monolingual dictionary during examination. There must be no annotation on any pages of the printed dictionary.

Instructions for Sitting the Examinations:

1. Reporting time

- 1.1 You are required to report to their examination centres at least 30 minutes before the start of each Examination, in your school uniform.
- 1.2 You are required to be seated at your assigned desks at least 15 minutes before the start of the examination.
- 1.3 You will not be given any make-up time if you report late for examination.

2 During examination

- 2.1 You must not open the question and answer booklets or start reading and writing unless you are told to do so by the examination personnel.
- 2.2 You must place your Ezlink pass or NRIC or foreign identification documents on your desk throughout the examination.
- 2.3 You should use non-erasable black or blue ballpoint pen during examination and 2B pencils for shading of the Personalised Multiple Choice Answer sheet.
- 2.4 You are required to submit their answers in the language in which the question paper is set, unless otherwise instructed by the questions.
- 2.5 You should avoid using **correction tape or fluid** on the answer script or writing paper as it may affect the legibility of the answers.
- 2.6 **You must not eat** in the examination room. However, you are allowed to drink water and the water bottle must be placed on the floor next to your seat.
- 2.7 If you are granted <u>access arrangements</u>, you should present the approved outcome letter to the examination personnel **before the start of the examination**. You must highlight immediately if your approved access arrangement is not given to you.
